The Foundation was established to foster, encourage, and enrich academic programs for Monroe One students. The Foundation works collaboratively with educational and business leaders to raise funds and award grants to staff and students.

The first Urban-Suburban students to be awarded the Destler/Johnson Rochester City Scholars program have been named!

RIT offers the program to graduates of the Rochester City School District and approved charter schools, which for the first time now includes Urban-Suburban students.

Throughout the academic year, scholars will participate in individual weekly meetings with a Multicultural Center for Academic Success coach and will receive support, guidance, and access to the campus resources available.

Through money provided from voluntary contributions, annual family dues, and program fundraisers, Urban-Suburban was able to raise \$14,500 for our students!

The scholarship was established in 1985, building off a \$3,000 grant donated by the Reidman Coportation of Rochester. Through a commitment by the Urban-Suburban staff and families, program parents have awarded nearly \$340,000 to 566 program graduates.
