Session I: Fractions as Sharing

Session II: Fractions on the Number Line

Fraction strips, tiles, discs, and a colorful student workbook all enhance the depth of learning. Filled with fun, humor, and involvement. COMMON CORE

Our three Fractions programs are intended for Grade 3, and are carefully aligned with the New York State Common Core as detailed by EngageNY. The Grade 3, Module 5 became the backbone of these activities. They were developed with painstaking adherence to these documents.

DOING WHAT WORKS

These programs were inspired by the highly regarded "Doing What Works" program from the US Department of Education. The DWW Practice Guide recommends improving student learning of Fractions by building basic concepts of sharing and proportionality, and using number lines to develop understanding of fractions as numbers.

LEARNING STYLES
