Initially it began in 1960 as:

- Monroe County Chief School Officers and School Board President (MCCSOSBP).
- Labor issues were the group's focus.
- Under the guidance of Dr. William Fullager, Dean of University of Rochester, College of Education.

In 1969:

Became affiliated with NYSSBA







- MCSBA CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS APPROVED.
- Held its first EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE meeting.
- Included 15 Boards od Education.
- Named James Green (Spencerport) 1st Association President.




In 1971:

- STEERING COMMITTEE formed to plan election of officers, prepare budget, & plan annual meeting.
- LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE established.

In 1972:

- Jann Packard was named Executive Director, she would serve in this role until 1986.
- Negotiations committee formed-(Would later become Labor Relations Committee).
- FACTS AND FIGURES BOOKLET first published.





Then and now

In 1975:

- MCSBA established an OFFICIAL LOGO.
- NEWSLETTER "News for MCSBA" startedwould eventfully become News Scope.
- PROSPECTIVE CANDIDATES SEMINAR began.
- **Published 1**st **legislative position,** dealing with state aid, BOCES, tenure, and the Taylor Law.





In 1977:

• SED approved NEW GOVERNANCE SEMINAR introduced.

In 1978:

LABOR RELATIONS COMMITTEE formed.

In 1980:

- MCSBA APPOINTED FIRST TREASURER.
- An Inter-district Cooperation Committee formed to explore ways to save programs during a time of rapidly declining enrollments; led to the development of BOCES programs in vocational/technical education and the performing arts.

In 1981:

- BOARD PRESIDENTS dinner initiated.
- MCSBA 's 1st solo bus trip to ALBANY.



In 1982:

• **FUTURES COMMITTEE** appointed for a year, developed 7 long term goals for the association. Annual goal setting process set by committee is still in use by the association.

In 1984:

Public Information committee became INFORMATION EXCHANGE COMMITTEE.

In 1985:

- Association reorganized, legislative action became a primary emphasis.
- MCSBA/MCBA LAW CONFERENCE began.

In 1986:

- John Woods was named Executive Director, he would serve in this role until 2001.
- MCSBA's We Grow Best Together campaign won a National School Public Relations Association Award of Merit.





In 1987:

• **COALITION BUILDING** began with regular meetings between MCSBA leaders and the two area Regents, the Gannett Editorial Board, NYSUT, NEA, and the Genesee Valley PTA were instituted.

In 1988:

- MCSBA members began meeting locally with state legislators.
- Mary Talbot hired as MCSBA Secretary.

In 1990:

Unprecedented mid-year cuts in NYS aid occurred as recession began
 Declining levels of state aid forced an increase in local property taxes.
 In the next two years over half the budgets in Monroe County were defeated on their first attempt.


In 1994:

First CLERKS CONFERENCE was held.

In 1996:

 BEST FOR LESS publication was developed to showcase collaborative and cost saving efforts of school districts to counter accusations of fiscal irresponsibility.





Then and now



In 2001:

- Jody Siegle was named Executive Director, she would serve in this role until 2015.
- Greatly increased level of advocacy efforts due to a large number of state and federal political initiatives.
- LEGISLATIVE BREAKFAST began.
- MCSBA website was up-dated and email became primary means of communication with members.

In 2002:

- MCSBA poster won honorable mention from National School Public Relations Association.
- FALL ALBANY TRIP began.

In 2003:

Dues were restructured, based on size of a district's annual budget.







In 2005:

- Kendall CSD joined the association, was 1st new member in decades.
- SED approved FISCAL OVERSIGHT TRAINING introduced.
- FALL MEETINGS with state legislators began locally.



In 2006:

• **SPRING MEETINGS** with federal legislators began locally.

In 2008:

• F.A.I.R PLAN enacted to take 50% of sales tax revenue from public schools. The association sued the county for its action. The Appellate Court and NYS Court of Appeals both ruled against the county's action and monies were paid back in installments over 5 years.





In 2009:

MCSBA became member of COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS.

In 2012:

- Judy Wadsworth retired after 24 years of service to MCSBA in various leadership roles.
- She continues to publish the News Scope and News Clips to the present day.

In 2013:

Steering Committee developed and added
 COMMUNICATIONS OUTREACH COMMITTEE (COAC)

In 2014:

CLERKS 2-YEAR SUMMER SERIES began.





In 2016:

Holley CSD joined the association.



In 2017:

ALUMNI AFFILIATE began.

In 2018:

VICTOR CENTRAL

- Victor CSD joined the Association.
- The Association amended its Constitution and By-laws to limit its membership to RCSD, & Monroe One BOCES and Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES, and their components districts and now Victor.

In 2019:

BOARD PRESIDENT/SUPERINTENDENT SYMPOSIUMS on "Leadership At Its Best" began.
