#### From Our Executive Director

As I write this, my final annual summary of our year at MCSBA, I cannot help but think back over my twenty-seven years of involvement with this organization, first as a school board member and then as the executive director. From the beginning, as I benefitted from being able to rely on MCSBA for information and the helpful perspective that comes from talking with other people facing the same challenges, I could see the value of this organization. Subsequently as its director I wanted MCSBA to continue to be a dependable source of support for our members.



As the work of school governance has changed, MCBSA's usefulness has become even more important. Although early in my school board career there were certainly concerns about state education policies and funding issues, no one anticipated the major impact future state and federal education laws would have on our local schools. Societal shifts in values and expectations have led to new education laws and regulations, which in turn have resulted in a continual churning of many activities that school leaders are involved in. Nevertheless, our schools are still the center of our communities, and they have become a testing ground for responding to change.

Our mission at MCSBA is to support school leaders in their work. Through our programs and services, MCSBA strives to bring information and understanding to the issues our districts face. As new school board members come into their responsibilities, the first thing they learn is how much they have to learn.

This year MCSBA organized over 50 separate programs including topic committee meetings, training programs, conferences, and advocacy trips, and specifics about these programs are described in this Annual Report. Additionally there were local meetings with our state and federal legislators and our Regents. We approved a new position paper on Full Funding for Public Education, put out talking points on a variety of topics, and updated our "Best for Less" booklet on shared services and the annual "Fact & Figures" publication. We have been busy - a Google search on Monroe County School Boards Association brings up 250,000 results!

Attendance at our programs has been strong and conversations with the media about education issues have been frequent. And as the issues have become more complex, the need to educate the broader public, in addition to our members, has become increasingly important. MCSBA is part of both the Monroe County Education Coalition and the Monroe County Superintendents' Public Education Advocacy Committee, two groups that work to inform the broader community about education issues.

In our community, the deepening public interest in education is exemplified by multi-pronged efforts to address the issues of neediness among children and especially the impact of poverty. Numerous groups have come together for the purpose of addressing specific problems or to run public forums on education this year. And MCSBA has been an active participant in these efforts. #### Full Funding for Public Education - Association Goal #1



The Legislative Committee began their work quickly this year by charging a subcommittee with developing a position paper that would speak to the need for the state to eliminate the GEA and return to a commitment to fully fund public education. By October, the committee forwarded their approved position paper onto the Steering and Executive committees. This became the guiding conversation of the association in all of its advocacy opportunities for the year.

#### MCSBA Members meet to learn about the Veteran's Tax Exemption





In November, the association held a special meeting for the membership to learn more about the Veteran's Tax exemption legislation that allowed school districts to offer exemptions to certain Veteran groups. Mark Kokanovich (BRI, MCSBA President), Lou Alaimo (BRI, Assistant Superintendent for Administration) and Robert Criddle, (Town of Ogden, Assessor), presented on the topic and answered questions for the membership.

### With Community Connections

MCSBA collaborates with a number of groups to promote public education.

The Monroe County Education Coalition (MCEC) which includes the PTA, school boards, superintendents, teacher unions, administrators, and school business officials. MCSBA provides and maintains a MCEC website at www.mcsba.org. This year the MCEC worked to develop a bulletin and an editorial opposing legislation that would redirect state resources away from public education and erode local control.

MCSBA continues its representation on the **Council of Governments** (COG) where members collaborate with other officials on common issues.

The Monroe County **Superintendents Public Education Advocacy** Committee (MCSPEAC) continues to develop information about our public schools to help the greater community understand the value and strengths of public education in our county. This year the committee worked with the Ad Council of Rochester to develop posters, yard signs, and business sponsored television commercials to highlight the success of our public school districts.

## By Getting our messages out Reporting

Each Friday, MCSBA emails an electronic news update on educational issues to members and others interested in staying abreast of current educational topics.

News Scope, the MCSBA newsletter, covers MCSBA events and educational issues. Readers include state officials, college presidents, attorneys and the media.

MCSBA also works with local media to help them understand and explain issues to the wider community.

#### Facts & Figure

Each year, copies of the MCSBA Facts & Figures booklet are given to MCSBA members, the media, elected officials and libraries. Sponsors cover the cost of this service. Other copies are sold to realtors.

#### 2014-2015 Conferences

Each year, MCSBA presents a number of conferences that attract school board members and administrators from within and beyond Monroe County. Also this year the association, in partnership with our member school district clerks, developed a full day school district clerk's conference to provide professional development from a "soups to nuts" approach. #### **Legislative Committee**

The Legislative Committee prepares and promotes the Association's legislative positions. This year, under the leadership of Julie Christensen(KEN) and John Piper (PEN), the committee developed the Full Funding for Education positon paper and arranged and promoted MCSBA members to attend meetings with NYS officials in Albany in December and March. In February, the Legislative Committee hosted its annual local breakfast meeting with NYS lawmakers to discuss the NYS budget proposal, mandate relief and the value of public education in Monroe County.

Also in February, several MCSBA members attended the National School Boards Association Annual Advocacy Institute in Washington, D.C. to meet with lawmakers. Members also attended the Capital Conference of NYSSBA that was held in March.

In response to public accusations of fiscal irresponsibility, **President Jody Siegle** spearheaded an initiative to revamp existing internal reports on cost savings measures into a public report on such measures with emphasis on collaborative efforts among districts and with other cultural and governmental agencies.
