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
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From the Director's Desk



Eastridge graduate recognized for multiple achievements

Sandy Chi, a dedicated graduate from Eastridge High School and the Urban Suburban program, was recognized as one of Monroe County's outstanding seniors. This honor is awarded annually to students who exemplify excellence in scholarship, leadership, service, and character. Sandy represents the spirit of the Dr. Michael C. O'Laughlin Outstanding Senior Recognition Program. Her achievements, leadership, and character make her a deserving recipient of this prestigious award.

Sandy was also Eastridge High School's Class of 2024 Salutatorian and received the Principal's Award during the Urban-Suburban Award Night.



West Irondequoit 4th Grader medals at Team USA national karate competition

Krisdiana Dillard has once again secured her spot on Team USA after earning a gold, silver, and two bronze medals at the World Karate Commission USA National Competition June 8-9, 2024. She placed first in Classical Kata, second in Sparring and Third in Weapons and Hardline Kata.

The middle school student has been devoted to karate for nearly three years and she's already a blue belt. Krisdiana was a green belt last summer, the first time she found out that she would represent Team USA on an international level. Krisdiana's mom tells us she brought home the bronze medal for Sparring at the 2023 World Championships in Orlando, Florida.

Now, after her latest wins at the National Competition, her mom says she is ranked seventh in the world in Kata and Weapons. The word proud doesn't begin to describe how Krisdiana's mom feels about her accomplishments.

The family's next stop is Portugal for the WKC World Championship 2024 this October.



West Irondequoit Outstanding Senior charts ambitious future

TeJon Tejada, a 2024 graduate of Irondequoit High School and recipient of the prestigious Dr. Michael C. O'Laughlin Outstanding Senior award has a clear path forward. His immediate plans include joining the Army National Guard and going to college. This decision-making process was highlighted in the West Irondequoit Central School District's video "Finding their Path."

In the video, TeJon explains that he learned about the Army National Guard at a work event in October 2023. He started considering it as an option when he found out that he would be able to work in the military and pursue his dreams.

His journey begins with bootcamp and Advanced Individual Training (AIT) to become an Information Technology Specialist. Following his military training, TeJon plans to attend college to study business and video. Though he has specific educational goals, he remains open to discovering his long-term career path over time.

"Even if you don't know what you're going to do, this gives you an opportunity to learn a new skill (and) meet a whole bunch of new people like you would do in college," said Tejada.
